	3 Office of Research and Development in Medical Education (RaDME)	Leads educational research and educational skills development for all UCSF faculty from its home in the School of Medicine. RaDME believes that choices about teaching and learning should be based on evidence and continually integrates ideas from educational literature into its programs
	3 Academy of Medical Educators	Supports and advances the teaching mission of the UCSF School of Medicine and the people who carry it out.
	4 Maintenance of Certification Approval Program (MOCAP)	Is an approved sponsor of the ABMS Multi-Specialty Portfolio Approval Program. UCSF's MOCAP supports, monitors, approves, and reports institutional quality improvement efforts to meet MOC Part IV requirements across multiple AMBS specialty boards.
Research Resources	5 Office of Career & Professional Development	OCPD offers career and professional development: giving information, teaching skills, and offering resources needed to navigate successful careers.
	6 UCSF Global Health Sciences	Integrates UCSF expertise in all of the health, social, and biological sciences, and focuses that expertise on pressing issues in global health. We support tools and resources spanning UCSF and the UC system fostering global endeavors, including the Global Projects Database, a faculty affiliation program, a consultation service, and a Global Research Compliance HUB.
	7 Office of Innovation, Technology & Alliances (ITA)	Helps our researchers partner with industry on research and clinical programs; supports and markets UCSF inventions to the commercial world; and provides education and resources to help researchers explore the entrepreneurial potential of their discoveries.
	8 Research Resource Program (RRP)	Created in 2010 to meet the UCSF need for coordination and support of centralized research core facilities.
	9 Academic Research Systems	Offers secure computing environments, tools, consulting services and access to UCSF Clinical data that support researchers.
	9 OnCore	Online Collaborative research environment.
	10 Research Development Office (RDO)	Fosters scientific collaborations between internal/external research teams and facilitates proposal development for large, multi-investigator project grants. RDO is also home to the Resource Allocation Program (RAP) and the Limited Submission Program (LPS).
	11 Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSI)	Provides a range of services and resources to support clinical and translational research. These include funding, training, inpatient and outpatient clinic space, recruitment services, expert consultation and technology products.
	12 Office of Sponsored Research	Partners with researchers to deliver effective proposals & administer awards.
	13 School of Medicine Information Services Unit (ISU)	Provides innovative IT software solutions to support faculty research, providing end to end support from idea conception through implementation. We specialize in user experience, design, web/mobile application development, and integrating data across disparate systems across UCSF and beyond.
	14 Ethics and Compliance Office	Organization collaborates with the UCSF community and senior leadership to coordinate and guide compliance efforts across the campus; to promote ethical behavior and research integrity; and to provide needed tools, guidance, and oversight.

Technology resources	14	<b>Human Research Protection Program (HRPP) / Institutional Animal Care and USE Program (IACUP)</b>	HRPP is comprised of the Committee on Human Research (CHR ), which is UCSF's Institutional Review Board (IRB), and the Quality Improvement Unit (QIU). The CHR reviews research involving human subjects to ensure the ethical and equitable treatment of those subjects and the QIU provides training and ongoing monitoring of approved human subjects research studies. IACUP-Administers the faculty committee (IACUP) that reviews all research proposals utilizing animal subjects. Conducts pre-review of research proposals to assist the researcher in preparing their application for formal review. Provides training to researchers on humane methods of animal handling and laboratory techniques. Conducts post approval monitoring of research activities to ensure the highest standards for animal health and welfare are met.
	15 - 16	<b>Information Technology</b>	Provide end to end information technology management, consulting, support, and centralized infrastructure services (Service Desk, Desktop field services, email, wireless, telecommunications) to UCSF, as well as a full range of technical consulting help.
	17	<b>Educational Technology Services (ETS)</b>	Central campus resource for classroom technical support, AV solutions, lecture capture, video conferencing, video recording, editing and production, as well as other audio-visual services.
	18	<b>Advance</b>	The campus system for managing academic appointment and advancement.
Faculty Welfare Resources	19	<b>Fidelity Retirement Services</b>	Provides the recordkeeping, communications, and financial education for UC employees for the 403(b), 457(b), and the DC Plan.
	19	<b>Benefits Specialty Center</b>	Administers the employee retirement and health and welfare programs for faculty and staff paid through the San Francisco campus, and conveys UCSF benefits interests and priorities to the Office of the President.
	20	<b>UCSF Health Care Facilitator Program</b>	Proactively works with active and retired UC employees to educate and resolve escalated problems involving health plan benefits and services which members have been unable to resolve themselves. Also provides education and consultation to increase knowledge and individual self-sufficiency as both consumer & patient. All services are confidential & free.
	21	<b>Office of the Ombuds</b>	Provides confidential, informal (off-the-record) and impartial problem-solving services in response to any workplace concern or complaint.
	22	<b>Faculty &amp; Staff Assistance Program</b>	FSAP offers confidential and free individual counseling and organizational consultation for all faculty, staff, residents, postdocs, and clinical fellows.
	23 - 24	<b>Office of Diversity and Outreach</b>	Provides programs and resources to faculty in the areas of Affirmative Action/ADA compliance, sexual harassment prevention and resolution, and the LGBT and Multicultural Resource Centers.
	25 - 27	<b>Campus Life Services</b>	Provides services to the UCSF community to help create a quality of life balance between work and academic life - fitness and wellness services, child care, parking, food service, housing, catering, community events, live and performing arts outlets.
Additional Faculty Resources	28	<b>University Relations</b>	Charged with directing strategic communications and public affairs for the campus and clinical enterprise through brand marketing, media relations, digital communications and internal communications. It also leads the University's community relations programs and its local, state and federal government relations efforts.
	29	<b>Academic Senate</b>	Facilitates faculty participation in campus governance related to education, promotions, research, campus finances, and welfare.
	30	<b>Office of Sustainability</b>	Encourages and supports efforts to reduce energy, waste and water through outreach, education, and engagement efforts.
	31	<b>Academic Senate Sustainability Committee</b>	Promotes sustainable practices by faculty through education, support of sustainability policies, embedding sustainability in curriculum and advocates for sustainable healthcare policies.
	32	<b>UCSF Library</b>	Supports faculty needs by providing research services, education/curricular support and tools, access to online resources/journals.
	33	<b>UCSF Privacy Office</b>	Monitors compliance with the federal and state privacy laws and regulations, provides consultations on privacy related questions, coordinates privacy investigations, and develops privacy training and risk mitigation programs.
