	5	Office for Postdoctoral Scholars Serves as a central resource and information conduit for all postdocs as well as faculty and staff who work with postdocs at UCSF.
	6	First Generation Support Services First Generation Support Services offers a variety of programs designed to meet the needs of UCSF first generation college students by offering community, resources and support. Faculty are welcome to participate by mentoring students and referring students for support.
Research Resources	7	UCSF Global Health Sciences A world-class educational, service and research organization that harnesses UCSF's scientific strengths to train global health leaders of tomorrow and develop solutions to today's most pressing health challenges. We support tools and resources spanning UCSF and the UC system fostering global endeavors, including the Global Projects Database, a faculty affiliation program, a consultation service, and a Global Research Compliance HUB.
	8	Office of Innovation, Technology & Alliances (ITA) Helps our researchers' partner with industry on research and clinical programs; supports and markets UCSF inventions to the commercial world; and provides education and resources to help researchers explore the entrepreneurial potential of their discoveries.
	9	Research Resource Program (RRP) The Research Resource Program (RRP) provides strategic planning and implementation of programs to support core facilities and other research resources at UCSF. The RRP also provides administrative, operational and financial management tools and support to core facilities.
	10	Research Data Systems Offers secure computing environments, tools, consulting services and access to UCSF Clinical data that support researchers.
	11	Research Development Office (RDO) Serves at the nexus of research and research administration to promote, support, strengthen, and grow the research enterprise at UCSF through several programs: 1) Resource Allocation Program (RAP), which manages the dissemination, submission, review and award of a wide variety of intramural funding opportunities; 2) Limited Submission Program (LSP), which manages the dissemination, solicitation and selection of proposals for limited submission funding opportunities; 3) Large Grant Development Program (LGDP) that supports proposal development for large, multi-investigator project grants; and 4) Team Science for Research Innovation Program (TSRIP) and Special Strategic Projects (SSP), which foster and facilitate scientific collaborations between internal and external research teams. http://rdo.ucsf.edu/
	12	Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSI) Provides a range of services and resources to support clinical and translational research. These include funding, training, inpatient and outpatient clinic space, recruitment services, expert consultation and technology products.

	13	Office of Sponsored Research	We partner with a range of administrative units in order to provide seamless sponsored project support to researchers. We provide expert administrative support to all researchers, from proposal development, to award negotiation and acceptance
	14	Supply Chain Management	We empower the business of the University by delivering intuitive, easy-to-use tools for purchasing goods and services. Through cost savings and innovative procurement processes, we help expand opportunities for teaching, research and public service
	15	Contracts and Grants Accounting	Collaborates with Principal Investigators, Research Administrators, the Office of Sponsored Research, other University units and sponsors to advise and provide oversight of the financial and post award management of sponsored research.
	16	School of Medicine Information Services Unit (ISU)	Provides innovative IT software solutions to support faculty research, providing end-to-end support from idea conception through implementation. We specialize in user experience, design, web application development, data security, and integrating data across disparate systems across UCSF and beyond.
	17	Ethics and Compliance Office	Organization collaborates with the UCSF community and senior leadership to coordinate and guide compliance efforts across the campus; to promote ethical behavior and research integrity; and to provide needed tools, guidance, and oversight.
	18	Human Research Protection Program (HRPP) Institutional Animal Care and USE Program (IACUP) Clinical Enterprise Compliance Program (CECP)	HRPP is comprised of UCSF's Institutional Review Board (IRB), and the Quality Improvement Unit (QIU). The IRB reviews research involving human subjects to ensure the ethical and equitable treatment of those subjects; the QIU provides training and ongoing monitoring of approved human subjects research studies. IACUP administers the faculty committee (IACUC) that reviews all research proposals utilizing animal subjects. The IACUP provides training to researchers on humane methods of animal handling and laboratory techniques; conducts post approval monitoring of research activities to ensure the highest standards for animal health and welfare are met. The Clinical Enterprise Compliance Program (CECP) partners with UCSF clinical enterprise leadership, managers, and staff to focus on compliance with state and federal laws, as well as university policies, that impact UCSF clinical enterprise personnel, patients, and organizational mission
Technology	19 - 20	Information Technology	Provide end to end information technology management, consulting, support, and centralized infrastructure services (Service Desk, Desktop field services, email, wireless, telecommunications) to UCSF, as well as a full range of technical consulting help.
	21	Educational Technology Services	Central campus resource for classroom technical support, AV solutions, lecture capture, video conferencing, video recording, editing and production, as well as other audio-visual services.
	22	Advance	The campus system for managing academic review (appointment, merit, promotion, etc.) and the academic leave process (sabbatical and professional development leave). Advance is where you will maintain your academic CV.
Faculty Welfare Resources	23	Fidelity Retirement Services	Provides the recordkeeping, communications, and financial education for UC employees for the 403(b), 457(b), and the DC Plan.
	24	Benefits Specialty Center	Administers the employee retirement and health and welfare programs for faculty and staff paid through the San Francisco campus, and conveys UCSF benefits interests and priorities to the Office of the President.
	25	UCSF Health Care Facilitator Program	Works with active and retired UC employees, residents/fellows, postdoctoral scholars, and their dependents to educate and resolve escalated problems involving health plan coverage, access, claims/billing and other complex issues. Provides education and consultation to increase knowledge of health plan design, the healthcare environment and improve overall health care/health insurance literacy to promote individual self-sufficiency as a consumer & patient. All services are confidential & free.
	26	Office of the Ombuds	Provides confidential, informal (off-the-record) and impartial problem-solving services in response to any workplace concern or complaint.
	27	Faculty & Staff Assistance Program	FSAP offers short-term confidential and free individual counseling and organizational consultation for all faculty, staff, residents, postdocs, and clinical fellows.
	28	Difference Matters	Differences Matter is a UCSF School of Medicine multi-year initiative focused on creating a diverse community and an inclusive culture that will work to close gaps in inequities in health and health care across all of UCSF's mission areas.
	29-30	Office of Diversity and Outreach	Office of Diversity and Outreach: Provides leadership for diversity, equity and inclusion efforts in recruiting, hiring, and promotion of faculty. The office's work is focused in the areas of outreach, education, training and compliance where it provides resources to faculty in the areas of Affirmative Action, disability and sexual harassment. 	35	University Development and Alumni Relations	The UCSF Foundation and the Office of University Development and Alumni Relations (UDAR) are responsible for fostering and strengthening campus outreach efforts to UCSF constituents and for garnering private support for the campus. In raising private support, UDAR identifies, qualifies, solicits and stewards donors for the schools, medical center, departments and programs on campus; accepts and administers all private gifts to the university through the Regents or the UCSF Foundation; and manages all alumni relations activities, campus support group activities and campus events.
	36	Academic Senate	Facilitates faculty participation in campus governance related to education, promotions, research, campus finances, and welfare.
	37	Office of Sustainability	Encourages faculty to support engagement around sustainability at UCSF, by providing outreach and education around the health link to energy, waste, toxics, food, and water. Employee benefits to support these efforts will be featured.
	38	UCSF Medical Staff Affairs	The UCSF Medical Staff Affairs Office provides services for faculty who do clinical work in the UCSF hospitals. We facilitate processes for credentialing/privileging and health plan enrollment for billing activity. We also support medical staff committees which help guide clinical operations at UCSF. The committees we support include the Executive Medical Board, Credentials Committee, Physician Well Being, Ethics Committee and many others. Our work ensures that UCSF complies with TJC and NCQA credentialing requirements as well as Medicare and Medi-Cal billing enrollment regulations.
